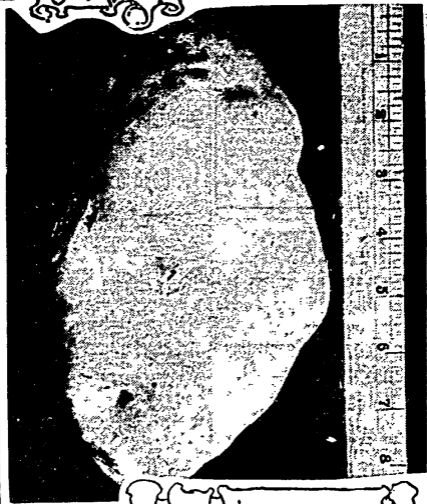


THIS POTATO—KING OF SPUDS

THE MIGHTY SPUD.

What is one of the best exhibits of local home-garden products is shown in the accompanying photograph. The potato, set beside a ruler, measures $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches in length.

This tuber, which was grown in the garden of George L. Pinther, 112 East Winona street, weighs $2\frac{1}{2}$ pounds. It is about five inches in diameter at the widest part. Its circumference is about 13 inches. A count revealed 17 eyes in the potato.

Mr. Pinther does not know what variety the specimen is, as he planted several kinds of seed in the same place. In all, he says, he planted about one-half bushel of seed. There were two other potatoes in the same hill that were about three-quarters the size of this giant.
